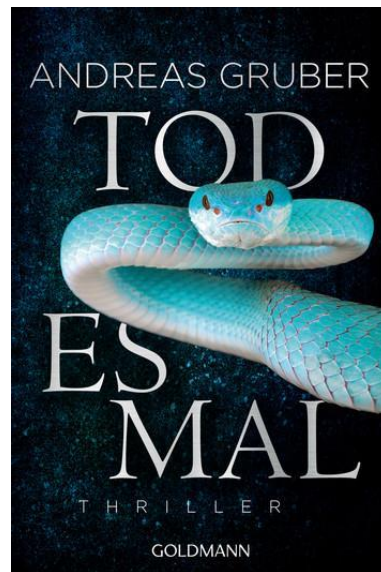


Seven days, seven people doomed to die – and with every hour hope dwindles ...

Andreas Gruber, born in Vienna in 1968, studied at the Vienna University of Economics and Business and now works part-time for a pharmaceutical company. He is a bestselling author and has twice been awarded the Vincent Prize and three times the German Phantastik Prize.

She is only prepared to discuss anything else with profiler Maarten S. Sneijder. But he has just handed in his notice, and so Sneijder's colleague, Sabine Nemez, interviews the nun.
