Rainer Oberthür, born in 1961, is the deputy head of the Catechetical Institute of the diocese of Aachen, a lecturer for religious education and elementary school teachers. He has published a myriad of books for children and adults dealing with the big questions of life, God and the world. For decades he has been examining heaven and the skies and the universe from a philosophical, biblical and astronomical point of view. At night, armed with binoculars and a telescope, he is an enthusiastic "star gazer".

To take children and their questions seriously is the motto of this unique bible for children. The underlying idea is that children AND adults go on a fascinating expedition through the biblical stories.

The Bible for Children and Everyone in the House contains texts and illustrations that captivate children, including the main texts of the Old and the New Testament. The stories are told appropriately for children and keep the richness and power of the biblical language. Explanations and information inspire curiosity and a grasp for the uniqueness of the bible.

30 paintings by Rembrandt, Turner, Nolde and many others underline the preciousness of the bible, invite to look and contemplate and give room and support to the fantasy and imagination of children. Every picture is shortly explained.
