**Jürgen Moltmann** studied theology as a prisoner of war in England and then, after his return to Germany, in Göttingen. From 1953 until 1958 he was a clergyman and university chaplain in Bremen and then a professor at the ecclesiastical college in Wuppertal. After a period in Bonn, he went to Tübingen, where he taught as a professor until his retirement in 1994. Since then he has had several guest professorships and been on numerous lecture tours. Jürgen Moltmann has been awarded myriad prizes and 15 honorary doctorates.

He has influenced the history of theology in post-war Germany as few others, and the works of no other living theologian writing in German have been translated as frequently into other languages as his. The Gütersloher Verlagshaus is honouring its author on the occasion of his 90th birthday with a special 9-volume edition of his main works. It is an invitation to meet one of the most influential theological thinkers of the present day in the context of the problems we are currently facing all over the world, and to discover his continuing importance.

With his book *Theology of Hope*, published in 1964, Moltmann became the "Herald of a new Protestantism". In the years to follow, he developed his thoughts in a total of eight volumes, thus creating a work that not only brought him international acclaim but also gave a new breath of life to a feeble and dispirited discussion about God and it provided new perspectives. Moltmann interprets the entire range of Christian and dogmatic theology in the context of the challenges of a modern world that has come of age.
